E001	<p><u>GALANTRY MEDALS</u></p> <p><u>Group of six. 102794 S. W. MURRAY</u></p> <p>Distinguished Flying Cross dated 1941 mint in case of issue. Air Force Cross dated 1946 (EF)</p> <p>1939-45 Star Africa Star, War Medal and Africa Service medal. Impressed as issued This is his full medal entitlement. The Campaign medals are VF</p> <p><i>The Citation for the DFC reads as follows "Lt Stanley William Murray. Following attacks on troop concentrations at Dessie and on M.T. on the road to Waldea on April/19/1941 Capt. Britz accompanied by 2 Lt Hanger was hit and compelled to make a forced landing on Kombolsha aerodrome. Lt S.W. Murray thereupon landed on the aerodrome in a gallant attempt to rescue his flight commander and his observer in the face of extremely accurate and constant enemy fire at short range. Only desisting in his attempt when signalled by Capt. Britz to take off again. Lieut. Murray displayed gallantry of the highest order and showed extreme devotion to duty in attempting to rescue his comrades."</i></p> <p><i>The citation for his AFC reads as follows.</i> <i>"This officer has done a total of 1830 hours of flying of which 1009 is instructional and 103 hours have been done during the last six months."</i></p> <p><i>He completed an operational tour. He is a good pilot and flying instructor as a testing officer his assessment of pupil's ability is always considered of very high value. He is a good organiser and his squadron at a Service Flying Training School is run most efficiently. Photocopies of service record show that he attested 10-10-1939 as a cadet pilot. He flew for 14 Squadron, 11 Squadron and 21 Squadron He was an instructor at various air schools from 9-2-42 to 7-5-45</i></p>	VF	65000

<p>Military Cross GVR unnamed as issued 1914/15 Star</p> <p>War and Victory medal Lieut J.A. ROCH</p> <p><i>“Born in 1890; educated at Prembrode Dock County School</i></p> <p><i>On the 1st September, 1914, John Aldrige Roch, of Main Street, Pembroke, was in South Africa. This simple fact is known, for on this date he took the King’s shilling to enlist as a Rifleman/Trooper in the Natal Light Horse, which, was amongst those units mobilized to repress the rebellion in South Africa later that month. He was again with the unit when engaged for the campaign in German South-West Africa in July 1915, but soon afterwards left the South African Defence Forces to undertake training for a commission in the British Army:</i></p> <p><i>Commissioned second Lieutenant, The Welsh Regt 16th Nov 1915</i></p> <p><i>Second Lieutenant, transferred to Machine Gun Corps 10th April 1916</i></p> <p><i>T/Lieutenant, Machine Gun corps (Infantry) 10th April 1916</i></p> <p><i>Lieutenant (in the Army, 1st November 1916</i></p> <p><i>In The re-organisation of Machine Gun Corps in early 1918, No. 8,9, 76 and 233 Machine Gun Companies, were unified in February at Coys., 3rd Bn. Machine Gun Corps. Headquarter elements were drafted, to which Lieut. Roch M.C. was appointed as Transport Officer. Meantime, an announcement was published in the London Gazette, 26th November, 1917, stating that Lieut Roch had been awarded the Military Cross ‘for distinguished service in the field; and that full particulars would be given at a later date. His citation was eventually published in the London Gazette of the 6th April, 1918, being likely in respect of operations concerning the Third Battle of Ypres:</i></p> <p><i>‘T./Lt John Aldrige Roch, Mach. Gun. Co. For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty in nightly, and on two occasions twice per night, leading his pack transport through heavy enemy barrages and gas to the gun positions, so that his company were never on any occasion short of ammunition, rations or water. His transport lines were bombed on three occasions, resulting in the loss of five animals and ten men. His coolness and prompt action saved much suffering to wounded men and horses’</i></p> <p><i>Given The circumstances under which he had earned his MC in 1917 he was obviously rolled as a Transport Officer, and probably for one of the aforementioned parent M.G. Companies of the new 3rd Battalion, all of which had been fighting on the Western front since July, 1917.</i></p> <p><i>T/Lieutenant, J.A. Roch, M.C., Machine Gun Corps (Infantry) relinquished his commission on completion of service, and retained the rank of Lieutenant, 4th November 1920. No further military service has been traced in his career until 1931; when, engaging in</i></p>

	<p><i>the Territorial Army, Roch was re-commissioned as a Captain in the (Pembroke Yeomanry) Battery, Royal Artillery, (T.A.) on the 4th February, 1931.</i></p> <p><i>Meantime, in 1922 he duly received his trio of campaign medals to add to the M.C. from the First World War. Curiously though, a handwritten note upon the official Medal Issue Card at PRO Kew states : ‘ No record of M in Ds in MS3.’ Though open to interpretation, the entry casts a degree of doubt upon his true entitlement to a m.e.d. emblem. Indeed, further investigation through the indexes of the London Gazette, and his service records in South Africa, have failed to trace confirmation of such an award.</i></p> <p><i>During his T.A. service, Roch was also a Military Member of the Territorial Army Association for Pembroke. Upon retirement from the T.A. in the mid 1930’2 with the rank of Major, he continued his work for the Association, extending through the Second World War and beyond. He became a Justice of Peace in 1943, and in 1949, he earned a further distinction in company with Air Vice-Marshal Sir Tom Ince Webb-Bowen, K.C.B., C.M.G; both being commissioned as a Deputy Lieutenants of the County of Pembroke, as of 25th August 1949 (London Gazette 6th September 1949). His address at the time was given as the Old Bank House, Pembroke. Roch eventually stepped into the role of Vice-Chairman of the Pembroke Branch, T. & A.F.A. in 1953; and remains listed as such at least until the August 1955 Army List. However, there is no further record of his in or after the December 1955 Army list.</i></p> <p><i>Further biographical information is given in Kelly’s Handbook, 1953, and is subsequent years. F.A.I. – Fellow of the Auctioneers and Estate Agents Institute.</i></p> <p><i>THE TIMES, FEBRUARY 4TH, 1963 OBITUARY</i></p> <p><i>MAJOR JOHN ALDRIDGE ROCH, M.C., who died at his home at Pembroke on Thursday (31st January) was appointed a Justice of the Peace for Pembroke in 1943 and became a Deputy Lieutenant for Pembrokeshire in 1949 (The Times, Feb. 4 (63); 4 (b))”</i></p>

Two copies of his book "Stick leader accompany the lot. A copy of the original citation accompanies the lot and reads as follows: <i>"Acting Sergeant Charles Warren joined 3 Commando 1st Battalion The Rhodesian Light Infantry on 19th November, 1974 and has been deployed on operations almost continuously since that date.</i></p> <p><i>During the period May, 1978 to July 1979 he has been involved in 30 successful fire force engagements as a stick leader. A total of 156 terrorists have been accounted for in these engagements. He has repeatedly been under fire, and he and his stick accounted for a large number of these terrorists.</i></p> <p><i>Sergeant Warren's aggressive action and personal leadership contributed greatly to the success of these engagements.</i></p> <p><i>On numerous occasions Sergeant Warren has been called on to control and command sweep lines in these engagements, and in so doing, has displayed fine qualities of leadership, often at a great risk to himself.</i></p> <p><i>On one occasion on 25th May, 1979 Sergeant Warren was the commander of a sweep line clearing a target area which contained approximately 40 terrorists. In the ensuing engagement one security force member was wounded and Sergeant Warren personally carried out the evacuation of this member to safety. He then reorganised the sweep line and completed the clearance of the target area. In this engagement 33 terrorists were accounted for. Sergeant Warren's gallantry and his concern for his fellow soldiers have been of the highest order and far beyond the call of duty"</i> His original 3 RLI Parachute logbook accompanies the lot.
