R	001A	WW2 Distinguished Flying Cross Group of Five named to 206420 Lieutenant Derek Ronald Bond 15th Squadron SAAF. Consisting of: Distinguished Flying Cross GEO VI engraved 1945; 1939-45 Star; Italy Star; 1939-45 War Medal & Africa Service Medal all named to 206420 D.R. BOND. Derek Ronald Bond was a colonial orphan who was born in Cape Town in 1923 he attested in 1942 and completed his pilots training with SAAF 22 Air School On 14th August 1942. He was promoted to Lieutenant on 14th February 1943. He was de-mobilized from the Airforce on 30th April 1946. Citation reads: One night in April 1945, this officer was detailed for a reconnaissance in the Padua area. A convoy of enemy transport was located. Whilst making his attack on this target his aircraft sustained serious damage and caught fire which spread from the cockpit and back along the fuselage. Lieutenant Bond gave the order to abandon aircraft. Although he sustained burns to his face, hands and legs, he remained at the controls and kept the aircraft steady so that his comrades could leave with a grater measure of safety. The fire was growing in intensity. The cockpit became almost enveloped. Not until he was satisfied that his comrades had left would he leave the controls. As he prepared to leave himself, the aircraft exploded. Lieutenant Bond was thrown out. He had apparently been stuck by a heavy piece of debris and rendered unconscious. Nevertheless, his parachute opened in some way, and he came down safely to the ground. It was here that he was found in a semi-conscious state and taken to hospital a short distance away. In hazardous circumstances this officer set a magnificent example of courage, coolness and fortitude" Including 6 pages of research. In addition, 33 photos of him in the dessert and various aircraft including the Baltimore which he flew in North Africa. Sold with copies of service record, a copy of the citation for the DFC and a photo album containing photographs of Lt Bond taken during his training in South Africa. He also flew the Baltimore Aircraft during the War.		R45 000

		In the 4th Operation in the afternoon 18 Bostons of numbers 12 and 24 Squadrons with an escort of 33 Kitty Hawks flew against strong point on the Wadiez Zerkine between the sea and the main road. Observers saw 72 bombs striking in close pattern. During the run up one of the Bostons was struck in engine and burst into flames. Lieut D.R. Davies (Brother of the Co of number 60 Squadron) was killed along with his observer Lieut D.M. Chaplin. Both gunners drifted into the sea. Flight Lieut L. Orlek being drowned but Flight Sergt D.C. Rowe survived as prisoner. Not a single enemy fighter was met. No doubt they've been well briefed on the storms of steel that would be put up.		
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
