He claimed he had served with Royal Natal Carbineers in 1927 and worked as a clerk with the South African Railways and Harbours. He was a member of the Church of England and nominated his mother who lived in Durban as his next-of-kin. On Attestation he was allocated to the HQ Coy and was immediately promoted to L/Cpl possibly due to his stated occupation as a clerk and his advanced age. He joined the UMR at Premier Mine where the unit had gathered with the rest of the 4th Infantry Brigade (Kaffrarian Rifles, 2nd Royal Durban Light Infantry and UMR) Various exercises were carried out there to get the SA Forces ready for war service culminating in divisional manoeuvres carried out in Bechuanaland (now Botswana) to hone their skills. On the 3rd of April 1941 the UMR were ordered back to Premier Mine by road via	VF	R900

		<p> Mafeking and Pretoria, from here they were moved to Zonderwater. During the later part of June 1941, they were entrained for Pietermaritzburg where they camped at Hay Paddock for a month in preparation for embarkation, and on the 21st July 1941 they embarked on the SS Elizabethville and arrived at Suez on the 14th August 1941. They immediately entrained for their campsite at Mareopolis arriving there on the 15th of August 1941. Less than 2 weeks later they were moved to El Alamein and with many other units were engaged in digging defences that would later become important in the North African campaign. Despite being well trained the unit was poorly equipped and often had to borrow transport from other units. At El Alamein the UMR carried out more makeovers under desert conditions. On the 6th October 1941 they were ordered to move to El Daba-Baqqush area to relieve the 2/5 Essex Regiment. During an enemy aircraft attack on an airfield being guarded by the UMR on the 11th October 1941, one corporal was slightly wounded thus becoming the first UMR casualty of the War. At the end of November 1941 the regiment relieved Die Middelandse Regiment at Fuka Station, Fuka wells plus its pumping station and Landing ground 017. On the 2nd December 1941 after an enemy air raid two delayed action bombs exploded killing a Sergeant Wotherspoon and Lieutenant Bell the Intelligence officer a man of outstanding abilities. A week later the 7th December the UMR moved towards the front in stages until finally by the 16th December 1941, they were in a position where they could become responsible for part of the frontline in the vicinity of Qabr El Shinish. From this point numerous reconnaissance patrols were sent out between the 18th and 29th December 1941. On the 31st December 1941 they took part in an attack on enemy positions to gain information on enemy artillery positions. These positions were subsequently constantly shelled. On the 13th January 1942 the UMR pulled back to Sidi Azeiz and were relieved by the Kaffrarian Rifles. On the 18th January 1942 they proceeded to Bardia and relieved the Rand Light Infantry. At Bardia the UMR carried out very successful salvage operations, recovering tons of ammunition, many transport vehicles and numerous weapons from anti-tank guns to rifles. On the 6th February 1942 they left Bardia and dug in at Bir Haqfet. From Bir Haqfet they moved with the rest of the 4th Brigade and set up defensive positions at Sollum-Halfaya. Seagar was granted a week's leave during this period from the 9th to the 15th February 1942. Digging of defences were continued by the UMR at Bir Air-Bir until the 20th March 1942 when they </p>

		<p>received instructions to move to Tobruk where they were to take over part of the town's defences. The southern sector of the Tobruk defenced had been allocated to the UMR, and by the 26th Marh 1942 the regiment had taken up its positions, having to take special care where they walked and camped due to the large amount of uncharted mines and booby traps. A day after arriving at Tobruk John Edward George Seagar was transferred to 8th Army HQ on detached duties, little did he know at that time how this transfer would affect his wartime service and possibly even have saved his life. He thus missed out on being taken POW with the rest of the UMR and as an older person might not have had the stamina for the long cold European winters and forced marchers without adequate supplies etc. However, a week after joining the 8th Army HQ he reverted to the rank of private, no reason given. He served with the 8th Army HQ for 5 months being granted a 5 day spell of leave from the 10th August 1942 to the 15th August 1942. A week later the 22nd August 1942 he was posted to the Imperial Light Horse Regiment. After serving less than a week in the field with the ILH he was admitted to the 18th Field Ambulance hospital with an Inguinal Hernia. He was discharged from hospital on the 30th November 1942 and returned to his unit. He was medically reclassified and was returned to the Union for "Further Military duties" embarking at Suez on the 1st January 1943 and disembarking at Durban 2 weeks later, on the 14th January 1943. Back in the Union he appears to have served with the ILH at the Reserve Brigades in Piet Retief and Hay Paddock, as well as spending some more time on rest and recovery leave. He was finally discharged at Pretoria on the 22nd September 1943 at the stated age of 45 (This being his correct age). He returned to his civilian occupation as a Checker with the SAR&H. He married Elizabeth Kok on the 18th January 1954 and passed away seven years later on the 17th December 1961 at 62 years and 7 months of age, leaving no children. His full medal entitlement consists of the 1939/45 Star; Africa Star; British War Medal and Africa Service Medal. They were posted to him on the 30th September 1954. It appears he was 42 years old on attestation; he gave a younger age so that he would be accepted into the Union Forces.</p>

		HMS Birkenhead (1845) The Birkenhead was wrecked on 26 February 1852 at Danger Point near Gansbaai, 87 miles (140km) from Cape Town in the Cape Colony. <i>All Overview</i> The wreck of the Birkenhead refers to the 1852 sinking of the British troopship HMS Birkenhead of the coast of South Africa, near Danger Point. Although a maritime disaster, it is most famous for the bravery of the male soldiers who prioritized saving the women and children first, creating the naval "women and children first" protocol, known as the "Birkenhead Drill" <i>The Disaster</i> ' The event: On February 26, 1852, the ship struck and uncharted rock while en route to East London, South Africa. The vessel broke apart quickly, and many soldiers sleeping in the lower decks were trapped and drowned. ' The location: The wreck occurred at Danger Point, near modern-day Gansbaai in South Africa. ' Casualties: Of the approximately 638 people on board, an estimated 445 perished. ' Survivors: Only 193 people survived.
